Description of the organisation

Lithuanian University of Educational Sciences is a major teacher training institution in Lithuania. With the start of its activity in 1935, its primary goal has been to educate a highly qualified professional in the chosen field of science and a professional teacher who is able to successfully operate in the fast-changing society, knowledgeable about the abilities and skills obtained and professionally active in the national educational institutions of different types as well as in different contexts of international co-operation. University offers undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate studies in humanities, social sciences, physical science, biomedicine and technologies. There are over 6000 students at the University presently. The University staff comprises 500 members of academic staff: Professors (Doctors and Habilitated Doctors), Associate Professors (Doctors), Lecturers and Assistant Lecturers.

Lithuanian University of Educational Sciences is a public institution of higher education of the Republic of Lithuania. The University is a public legal entity, operating as a public institution. ## Experience and Expertise of the organization in the project's subject area

University teachers - experts have experience in doing research work related to early school leaving prevention, in vocational guidance, in designing training programs for school counsellors and teachers. University teachers have been involved in many international projects focusing on school management and teacher training. In the framework of the European projects implemented by the University and foreign partners special programs were designed for vocational guidance specialists.

#### Contributions that can be provided to the project

Designing special programs, modules for vocational guidance specialists and teachers working with early school leavers, designing and implementing personalized guidance services to motivate students at risk of early school leaving to complete their studies, creating tools for counsellors and teachers for identification of students potentials. University will contribute with its teachers' expertise in creating intellectual tools and testing them; will involvesecondary and vocational schools into the activities of the project; will exchange experience and expertise in dealing with students at risk of early school leaving, in bringing business world closer to school; will disseminate the project activities and will assure its sustainability in Lithuania.

#### Reasons of involvement in the project

University is training in-service teachers of secondary and vocational schools and gets feedback from them about lack of methodological and practical support for the teachers and counsellors working with early school leavers, for vocational guidance specialists. Schools need closer cooperation with business world in order to motivate learners to continue their studies and to choose the career. This project provides good opportunities for designing special intellectual tools for teachers and counsellors. The Lithuanian university of educational sciences is willing to contribute with its expertise and to be a part of the team creating intellectual tools. The tools created within the framework of the project will help to determine early school leavers and drop - outs individual competences and their abilities, will help teachers and consultants to take appropriate prevention

measures, to use new methodologies, to gain experience from foreign partners, will enhance their competences in consulting and guiding students to choose a profession. The percentage of early school leavers will decrease, cooperation between schools and business companies will become more efficient, vocational guidance system will gain stability and purposeful course.
